Now You Know Music Notes

"Carol of the Bells" is a popular Christmas carol, with music by Ukrainian composer Mykola Leontovych in 1914 and lyrics by Peter J. Wilhousky. The song is based on the Ukrainian folk chant *"Shchedryk"* which means "Bountiful Evening" and is a Ukrainian New Year's song, known in English as "The Little Swallow". *Shchedryk"* was also arranged by composer and teacher Mykola Leontovyc and tells a story of a swallow flying into a household to sing of wealth that will come with the following spring. "Shchedryk" was originally sung on the night of January 13, New Year's Eve in the Julian Calendar

With the introduction of Christianity to Ukraine, the celebration of the New Year was moved from April to January and "Shchedryk" became associated with the Feast of Epiphany also known in Ukrainian as *Shchedry vechir*, January 18 in the Julian calendar. It was originally sung on the night of January 13, New Year's Eve in the Julian Calendar (December 31 Old Style), which is Shchedry Vechir. In modern Ukraine, the song is again sung on the eve of the Julian New Year (January 13).

"Shchedryk" was later adapted as an English Christmas carol, "Carol of the Bells", by Peter J. Wilhousky of NBC Radio, following a performance of the original song by Alexander Koshetz's Ukrainian National Chorus at Carnegie Hall on October 5, 1922. Wilhousky copyrighted and published his new lyrics (which were not based on the Ukrainian lyrics) in 1936, and the song became popular in the United States and Canada, where it became strongly associated with Christmas. Although "Carol of the Bells" uses the melody from "Shchedryk," the lyrics of these two songs have nothing in common. The ostinato of the Ukrainian song suggested to Wilhousky the sound of ringing bells, so he wrote lyrics on that theme.

Typically, advent calendars are filled with candy and you open one each day starting December 1st and ending on Christmas Day. Reverse advent calendars allow you to donate or give something each day – thus giving instead of getting. The concept is to set aside an item each day from your pantry and put it into a box or basket and bring into the church weekly or all at once on Christmas Eve. Of course, you can always choose to do this same concept in a different way such as setting aside a \$1 (or other designated amount) in a basket each day and donating the collection to Tuesday's Supper and One-Stop Shop. Reverse Advent Calendars are a great way to share with others this Christmas season.

Imagine This...

Imagine this. A young clergyperson graduates from seminary, tens of thousands of dollars in debt, and eagerly takes their first call. It's a small church, but they have a lot of heart. They can't pay Conference guidelines, and benefits are pretty scarce, but they love their pastor. There are a lot of casseroles. The parsonage is nice, and the church works hard to maintain it and keep good boundaries. The church never once forgets their pastor's ordination anniversary. The pastor is making ends meet, barely, if they make the minimum payment on everything. Then they discover they need a medical procedure not covered by the basic (non-Pension Boards) insurance the church provides. What will they do? Take out a loan to save their own life?

Multiply that across a career's worth of years and emergencies and student loan payments. How will that pastor ever retire? What kind of life will they have if they do? What good will a former parsonage and all those loving casseroles do then? Who will show them the love of Christ other than the good people at the United Church Board for Ministerial Assistance, who administer the Christmas Fund?

If any of this scenario makes you anxious, or mad, you can do something about it: give as generously as you are able to the Christmas Fund for the Veterans of the Cross offering. The Christmas Fund is our United Church of Christ's way of taking care of that pastor—and all UCC pastors and church professionals—throughout their careers and beyond.

In 2021, gifts to the Christmas Fund enabled:

- Monthly pension supplementation for 231 retired clergy and lay employees (\$1,104,479)
- Health benefits supplementation for 87 retired clergy and lay employees (\$177,600)
- Emergency grants for 53 individuals and families (\$150,338)
- Christmas "Thank You" gift checks to 509 retired clergy and lay employees (\$254,000)
