



Your sacrificial giving is necessary to keep all of our ministires going. Thank you for giving generously to the work God is leading us into. The holidays are over and a new year is here. What will you do with it? Will you focus on what has passed or will you go forward with determination and energy? Now is the perfect time to head in the right direction. Be positive about your future and set good things in motion!

One of the best things for your overall health is to set aside 20-30 minutes every day for yourself. Read a scripture passage or daily devotional guide to help you focus and prepare. Take that time to calm and center yourself. A new year is usually full of resolutions. Make ones you can stick to. Plan to be more active; this can be hard in the winter months but be determined! Walk at an indoor mall or gym area. You can even do laps in your own home or commit to stair climbing several times a day. Park farther away from the store when shopping - every little bit helps.





Don't forget about healthcare screenings. Men, women and children should all have regular screenings with a healthcare provider to help prevent illness and maximize health. Children should be screened at least yearly for wellness and immunizations. All adults, especially those between the ages of 50 and 80, also need regular visits to a healthcare provider. Some screenings for adults include checking the abdominal aorta for aneurysms, blood pressure, cholesterol, colorectal cancer, depression, diabetes, bone density, immunizations and fall prevention. Any smoker aged 50-80, even those who quit within 15 years, should have a lung cancer screening. Women need evaluated for mammogram and cervical cancer screenings. Vitamin D has been a frequent medical topic over the last few years. Low vitamin D is common because people are spending less time outside in the sun (especially in the winter); sunlight provides needed vitamin D. Low vitamin D has been linked to poor cognitive (brain) function as well as increased dementia. Recent studies show that low vitamin D may also play a role in schizophrenia. Foods that will raise your vitamin D level include salmon, trout, tuna, fortified milk and orange juice, yogurt, cheese and mushrooms. (Imagine that- mushrooms grow faster in the dark but have lots of vitamin D to offer!)


January 16 – Martin Luther King Jr. Day
