Reader 1: O God, we light the first candle of Advent. (light the first candle)

Reader 2: We kindle it with hope. We long for you to come to our world, to break through and reign with compassion, justice, and peace.

Do not be exceedingly angry, O God, and do not remember iniquity forever. Now consider, we are all your people.




