#### A Voice Julian of Norwich

My name is Julian. I lived in the 14th century in Norwich. Like many women of my day, I was an Anchoress, seeking solace in the order of prayer and meditation. I loved the daily cycle of prayer. I loved the quiet moments of reflection and the beauty of worship.

My life was simple... unremarkable...Then one day in May, 1373, all that changed. God chose me... me... to bring a message of hope to our dark and frightening world.

There, where friend and foe alike were being cut down by the scourge we called Black Death, where young and old waited grimly for the bearer's wagon to take them to their grave, there God spoke to me in a series of revelations... clear as day... loud as the Crier's call they came...overwhelming... compulsive... decisive.

He showed me a little thing, the size of a hazelnut, on the palm of my hand, round like a ball. I looked at it thoughtfully and wondered, "What is it?" And the answer came, "It is all that is made." I marveled that it continued to exist and did not suddenly disintegrate; it was so small. And again my mind supplied the answer, "It exists both now and forever, because God loves it."

And therein I saw three truths: the first is that God made it; the second is that God loves it; and the third is that God sustains it.

And so it is with us, our body, mind, and soul. God will not let us go. We shall not perish. In Christ is salvation. In him we have our life... our being ... our all.

## A Voice John Wesley

My name is John Wesley. I was an Anglican priest who lived in the 18th century.

Until I was 35 years of age, I knew there was something lacking in my life. I had been part of many groups; the best known of them was the Holy Club at Oxford. Always, always, always, I was looking for one thing — to know God — personally, intimately and to know Jesus as the Christ.

No amount of rigor, method, prayer, or study sufficed. I could not find that faith for which I longed so much. Then, on May 24th, 1738, in Aldersgate Street, it happened. I felt my heart warmed with the inner glow of the Spirit, and I knew I did trust in Christ, and Christ alone for my salvation; an assurance was given me that he had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of

sin and death.

For the next 50 years I purposed to tell the world of this wonderful Savior. From England to the Americas I sang, preached, and argued for the souls of others. The movement I began has now spread to the four corners of the earth. I could never have imagined it would be so... but let this be known... it is not the Methodist Church or our hymns for which I would be remembered... No!... Only this Christ is God's means of salvation... and in him alone can we trust.

### A Voice Dietrich Bonhoeffer Address

My name is Dietrich - Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Many of you will know of me. Some may even remember me. What a life I have lived. Ahhh, those early years, growing up in the midst of things, in the center of culture, at the heart of learning, mixing with the greatest Christian minds. It was wonderful, breathtaking, and delightful. My career seemed assured - lecturer, pastor, teacher - in the old language, a prince of the confessing church!

How could I have ever known?

He was literally like a thief in the night, creeping up upon me, overtaking me, demanding of me the faith I had proclaimed in him. He changed everything. No longer an academic pursuit, this Jesus demanded of me a righteousness, a life lived out in faith and courage. In the face of that worm Hitler and his henchmen, how could I be silent?

And in the face of my church's quietude, how could I turn my back?

Whether the plot to kill Hitler was right or wrong, you be the judge.

This is all I know... in Christ I found my life, and in that life I found the cause of justice, and in that cause I found true faith! Though it did cost me my life upon that scaffold, I would not change a thing.

Each of us must face the decisive moment - that moment when you know it is all or nothing. What does life amount to if it is but days lived out without a cause, without a meaning? Do I regret it all? Not a moment! To live is Christ, to die is gain!


## Wednesday Night Potluck and Study (6PM in the Chapel)
