I have good counsel and sound judgment; I have understanding and power as well. Rulers reign because of me, and administrators issue just judgments. Because of me governors govern well, and the noble apply justice. I love those who love me; and those who seek me out zealously find me. Riches and honor are with me enduring wealth and prosperity. The gifts I distribute are better than gold, even fine gold; and my profits are better than fire-tried silver. 
