Get Canned - A Parish Nurse Note

February is, among other things, Canned Food Month. Canning food was originally started to prevent "seasonal starving," the dwindling of the previous year's food supply before a new harvest could be made. There is controversy about which is nutritionally better: fresh or canned products. Both have positives and negatives. Canned food is picked at the peak of freshness to be processed. There is greater diversity in canned goods than fresh, usually dependent upon your geographical location. Canned goods are generally less costly than fresh items. Their shelf life is longer than fresh food and canned goods are available all year. No refrigeration is needed. The process of canning involves adding heat and usually some sort of liquid. Studies completed at Michigan State University and the University of California at Davis indicate that the most unstable nutrients in the canning process are Vitamin C and other water-soluble vitamins. Some of these nutrients are decreased during the canning process. Sodium (a taste enhancer) is often added to foods during the canning process, creating higher than normal levels. Additional sugar may also be used during canning.



You may think that fresh foods are not "processed." They are, however, to some degree. They are washed, graded according to size, packaged, shipped and possibly put in cold storage before it reaches your table, all contributing to the loss of some of their nutritional values. Freshly harvested produce loses its Vitamin C content rapidly once it is picked. Peas were found to lose over 50% of their Vitamin C within 24-48 hours of harvesting. Apples may be coated with alginate (a

gelatinous -forming film) to protectickenike and stabilize its color. Oranges may have been exposed to ethylene gas, which forces fruit to ripen and occurs naturally in nature.

Tomatoes that are canned have a higher amount of lycopene, an antioxidant that prevents cell damage, than fresh ones. Pumpkin also contains higher nutrient levels after canning than fresh pumpkin (the addition of heat releases the nutrients.)

It is up to you to make healthy choices! Buy canned goods that are packed in water (not oil) and that are "no salt added." All canned goods can be rinsed well prior to cooking to help decrease that sodium and sugar added during processing.

Remember, when cooking, it's OK to get canned.


