Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me. And so we remember:

All: the command to love as he has loved.

One: We remember:

All: the life of God poured out for us like wine.

One: We remember:

All: the resurrection that shattered the power of death.

One: We remember:

All: Christ's ascension into heaven and promise to come again.

One: Extravagant God, pour out your Spirit on us and on this bread and cup. Let the fragrance of your love fill this house.

All: Come, Holy Spirit.

One: Let it fill our noses with the sweetness of grapes and the earthiness of wheat.

All: Come, Holy Spirit.

One: Let it fill our hearts as lavish compassion for the little, the lost, and the least.

All: Come, Holy Spirit.

One: Let this bread and cup magnify your prodigal love, mirroring the heavenly feast that has no end. Bring us at last to the infinite table where you have gathered all your holy ones in the new creation where every tear is wiped away, and every need has been met in you.
