WORD FOR CHILDREN

SCRIPTURE Acts 16:16-23

One day as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a female slave who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling. While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, "These men are slaves of the Most High God, who proclaim to you the way of salvation." She kept doing this for many days. But Paul, very much annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, "I order you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And it came out that very hour.

But when her owners saw that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace before the authorities. When they had brought them before the magistrates, they said, "These men, these Jews, are disturbing our city and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us, being Romans, to adopt or observe." The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods. After they had given them a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Invitation

One: This is the joyful feast of the people of God. People will come from north, south, east, and west to sit at the table in the realm of God.

All: Here in this place, the communion table is open to people of all races, creeds, sexual orientations, economic circumstances, and ages: adults, teens, and children.

One: This is the Lord's table, we are invited to share the feast which he has prepared.

One: God be with you.

All: And also with you.

All: We lift them to God.

One: Let us give thanks to God Most High.

All: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

One: Let us continue in prayer...

Holy God we believe in you for you made the world. You love it. You smile on it. You created human beings each to be different and asked us to get along with each other. You asked us to share and love each other and we are here committing ourselves to the task. We believe in Jesus Christ who came among us insignificantly, and walked among us incognito; who, to change the world, called disciples friends, and called people away from security; who befriended those whose company would discredit him; who pardoned those who deserved to be condemned; who spoke the deepest truths; who contradicted common sense by taking on the cross and taking on the grave and being liberated to live on the third day. This Jesus calls us today, now as then, to a life which is absurd by the standards of the world.

We believe in the Holy Spirit through whom God surprises, disappoints, cajoles and questions us; who is the bringer of strength and source of humor; who leads us to discover the truth we avoid; and we believe that the foolishness of God is wiser than the wisdom of the world and we rejoice that God has made it so.

For when we were nothing, You made us something; when we had no name and no faith and no future, You called us your children; when we lost our way or turned away, You did not abandon us; when we came back to You, your arms opened wide in welcome. And, look, You prepared a table for us offering not just bread, not just wine, but your very self, so that we may be filled, forgiven, healed, blessed, and made new again.

Unite us in this sacrament that we may become, for You, your body, loving and caring in the world. Until your will be everywhere done...Amen.
