



Consistory Highlights

The Consistory continues to move forward with its visioning and strategic planning efforts. Congregation members are encouraged to complete an appreciation survey to help celebrate our strengths and shape our future. A companion community resource survey will engage neighbors and partners to assess broader community needs. The Visioning Committee is considering using the parsonage for gatherings and events as a potential source of income in addition to moving the History Room to the first floor.

Everyone is strongly encouraged to attend the "Transform Church: Transform Community" workshop on June 28, from 9am to 2pm This important gathering builds on the momentum of our recent visioning event and will help us further shape and solidify a shared vision for the future of our church and community.

In other updates, a major facilities issue was discussed: the flat roof over the education wing estimated to be around 75 years old—is experiencing significant leaks and must be replaced. Estimates for the new roof range from \$35,000 to \$60,000. The Properties Committee has been authorized to select a contractor and move forward with the replacement.

The Youth Group launched successfully and received a \$1,000 grant from the Catoctin Association to support its development.

Key upcoming events include the start of the summer worship schedule on May 26 (worship at 10am), Vacation Bible School June 23-26, and a mission trip in July.

Celebrating Pride Month

At a time when LGBTQ+ rights are under attack across the country, this year's Pride Month calls us to show up with courage and solidarity. Pride is not only a celebration—it is a vital expression of visibility, resistance, and hope for the community.

Not Just a Headache – A Parish Nurse Note

Migraine headaches involve more than just an annoying pain. They can last from 4 to 72 hours and have varied intensities. These headaches are often accompanied by nausea and sensitivity to light, strong odors, and sound. They can be worsened by physical activity. These headaches are usually throbbing in nature and involve one side of the head. Sometimes an aura, or set of warning symptoms, occur 5 to 60 minutes before the headache starts. These pre-headache symptoms can include changes in vision, ringing in the ears, muscles weakness, numbness, tingling and trouble speaking and concentrating. Needless to say, a migraine headache can be incapacitating. About 12- 15% of people suffer from migraines and women are affected more than men. This type of headache can occur a few times over several months, or several times in



Different things can trigger a migraine: changes in hormone levels, stress, lack of sleep, exercise, skipping a meal, and certain foods (aged cheese, alcohol, chocolate, pickled or fermented foods, nitrates, MSG additive {monosodium glutamate}, and processed foods, such as pepperoni and hot dogs.) The cause of migraines can be environmental or genetic. About 80% of migraine sufferers have a first degree relative (parent or sibling) that also have these headaches.

Migraine headaches have also been associated with an increased risk of stroke, brain scarring (as shown on MRI scans), and heart defects (PFO- patent foramen ovale – a hole that is between the upper chambers of the heart).

Treatment for migraine headaches has advanced over the past few years. Oral pain medications as needed, Triptans (acute treatment to block pain pathways), beta blockers and calcium channel blockers (preventative), anti-nausea medications, nasal sprays for quick action, GCRP's (gene related peptide receptor antagonists that block the extra GCRP proteins that can cause migraines), and even the most poisonous toxin known to humans (Botulinum {Botox} that interferes with pain pathways) can all be used to treat migraines. All of these medications, even the over-the-counter pain medications, should be monitored and used under a health care provider's direction.

Other treatment/comfort measures include resting in a cool, dark room, cold compresses to the forehead and back of the neck, scalp massage, remaining calm, and circular pressure

the temples. A postdrome (symptoms that happen after a migraine) can last from a few hours to 2 days. These after-symptoms are similar to an alcohol hangover, and include fatigue, stiff neck, nausea, dizziness and difficulty concentrating.

If you think it's a migraine, seek medical help- it is MORE than just a headache!
