We also have a monthly donation focus, in August we will be collecting cans of fruit and laundry pods.





# **Zion Updates**

We began the journey to repair/restore our cemetery headstones several years ago supported by grant money from the Mary K. Bowman Foundation and more recently through the Roscoe Trust Fund. This work is not trivial, given that many of these headstones date back to the early days of Hagerstown and include the memorial for Jonathan Hager. It takes special expertise to restore the headstones to a semblance of their original beauty. By the end of August, the currently funded repair work project should be completed. The goals of the headstone and cemetery project are to show the proper respect for the souls buried here and to maintain a significant part of Zion's and Hagerstown's history by providing a peaceful and well-maintained cemetery where visitors can pause and reflect. While we are wrapping up this endeavor, history tells us that our efforts will continue into the future.

### **Visioning Update**

The Zion Reformed UCC Visioning Team has been listening and whittling a plan. Here are elements that will be coming for your input:

### Mission Priority 1 - Utilizing the Parsonage.

Move the History Rooms content over to the ground floor.

- Provide basic climate control.
- Paint the interior.
- Put up temporary sign that it contains our history room.
- Move items over.

Later contingent on funding, likely a Capital Campaign.

- Activate water in building after plumber reconnects water.
- Install HVAC system(s)
- Add interior cameras.
- Update bathrooms.
- Create a permanent sign.
- Add Musical Instruments to front lawn.

### Mission Priority 2 - Better Use of Church Space

Prepare the parking lot spaces for rental long-term and short-term.

- Rehang rear iron gate.
- Update rental contracts and fees.
- Clean the vacant History Rooms upstairs for rental and downstairs for our use.

Later contingent on funding, likely a Capital Campaign.

- Add kitchenette, upgrade bathroom moving entry door to hallway rather than maintenance room.
- Add keypad locks for entry to the floor we are renting.
- Add additional cameras.
- Complete new ADA entrance and exterior and interior way-finding signage.
- Add better coffee station in Kitchen or Chapel.
- Consider upgrades to kitchen.
- Add new fencing behind parsonage.
- Restore Tower entry doors and replace the transom's plexiglass protector.

### Mission Priority 3 - Grow Our Gathering

- Approve new committee structure and make bylaw changes.
- Refresh look of website.
- Design new opportunities for members: Parents night out, etc.
- Create liturgical drama group.

Later contingent on funding, likely a Capital Campaign.

- Add electronic sign (see Frederick Presbyterian Church)
- Consider uplighting the tower.
- Improve parking signage and flow.


