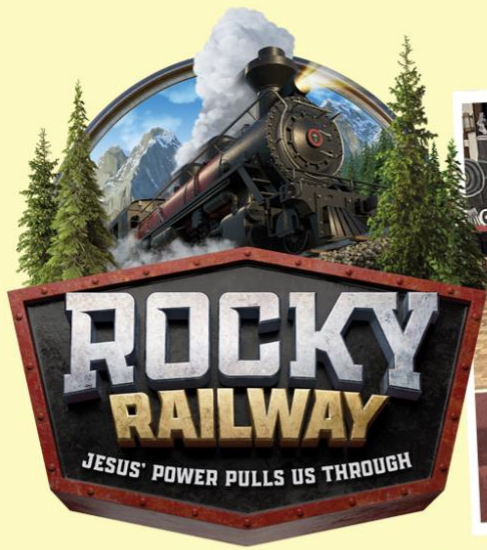

# Consistory Highlights

The Consistory continues to move forward with its visioning and strategic planning efforts. We have recently had several potential renters reach out to us, for single person use up to a company potential rental for 5 to 10 people. We may be in a position to move quickly if these opportunities move toward fruition. While we are continuing with the idea to move the History Room to the 1st Floor of the Parsonage, as well as renting out the second floor of the parsonage. We have also reached out to the Washington County Historical Society to see if we might join forces to host events in the parsonage. We will not move forward with any final decisions without a full congregational vote. But it sure is exciting to see such a vibrant burst of activity at Zion.

We have chosen the vendor to replace the flat roof over the CE Building. They will begin work as soon as permits are issued by the city.

Please note the new exterior painting of the parsonage. Burnie Clutz has agreed to do a bit of work on its landscaping to finish our beautification!

We have just received 2 grants for our outreach programs. We received \$8,458 grant from United Way, to help support our Soup Kitchen and Food Pantry. We also received a \$3,000 grant from the Funkhouse Foundation, to purchase a new stove for our Food Preparation area in Fellowship Hall.

# What's Bugging You – A Parish Nurse Note

As the weather warms up and you spend more time outside, you're not alone. Warm weather brings out the bugs. Yikes! Insect stings and bites can be a summer nuisance or a life-threatening emergency if you are allergic. Ants, bees, wasps, ticks and mosquitoes can sting, bite and sometimes transmit diseases. But don't let this interfere with enjoying the outdoors. There are a few things you can do to protect yourself from these critters.



Avoid scented lotions, perfumes and other products while enjoying the outdoors. Wear protective clothing (long sleeves and pants), hats and gloves when working in the yard or hiking in the woods. Carefully inspect your skin after being outside. Ticks, which can transmit Lyme disease, seem to like tight spots; check under your arms, your navel, behind your knees, around your waist and any other places where your clothes press on your skin when looking for ticks. Cover

any outdoor food to discourage bees and wasps from visiting. Drain areas of standing water to lessen spots where mosquitoes can gather and breed. Using an insect repellent that incorporates DEET or picaridin is recommended to keep the bugs away. Studies have shown that these products are safe and effective. Move to a safe area if you find yourself in the midst of a swarm of insects.

Symptoms of insect bites and stings range from mild stinging, itching and redness to facial swelling, difficulty breathing, dizziness, confusion and hives. These more serious symptoms can be life threatening and require immediate medical attention. If you are allergic to bees or other insects, ALWAYS have an EpiPen with you. The majority of insect bites are self-limiting (they go away on their own). Products that lessen the discomfort and itch include over-the-counter pain medications, antihistamines (Claritin, Allegra, Benadryl), ice application, and lotions with menthol to cool the area. Be alert for worsening symptoms, such as increased redness and swelling of the area affected, or generalized aches, fever and malaise.

Summer is a great time to be outside! Don't let the insects bug you. Be vigilant and follow the outlined tips for a terrific outdoor experience. And remember....only about 10% of insects are harmful. Enjoy!!
