## **Zion Ministry Highlights**

The Properties Committee's work never ends. The extreme heat has impacted progress on the headstone repairs but Burnie continues to plant and beautify the area around our parsonage! The building permit to replace the Education Wing roof was finally received so this work should begin anytime now. A quote for new ceilings for the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor rooms damaged by the roof leaks will be investigated once the roof is repaired.

Plans for repurposing the parsonage continue to be discussed. At this time we are in agreement that the History Rooms' contents should move to the first floor of the parsonage once that area is cleaned and painted. This plan will be presented to the Consistory for approval at their next meeting.

A new stove for the Soup Kitchen courtesy of the Funkhouser grant was purchased and installed. Other projects in the planning/working stages include the sidewalk repair, lighting in the cemetery in advance of the 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration, and the drainage issue in the cemetery from the Sanctuary runoff.

Scott presented the Interface with Visioning Team Goals with the team. This interface allows both groups to move forward with the various initiatives within the boundaries of our current budget and establishes areas to be funded through our proposed Capital Campaign. And so the work continues!

Shiver me timbers, it's September. (The 19<sup>th</sup> is talk like a pirate day). September is World Candle month, Sourdough September, and Ginger Cat Appreciation Month. Some special days include Read a Book Day(6<sup>th</sup>), National Hummingbitd Day (7th), Star Trek Day (8<sup>th</sup>), Swap Ideas Day (10<sup>th</sup>), and Patriot Day (11<sup>th</sup>). But perhaps the most important designated day in September is the 28th- National Good Neighbors Day. There are so many ways to help your neighbor, it's hard to list them all. Assisting with yard work is a good way to get exercise while you are helping. Try taking a neighbor to an appointment or bringing them to church. Cook some extra food and share a meal with your neighbor. Plant a little extra in your garden- vegetables or flowers- and share the crop. Maybe all you need to do is take the time to sit and chat with your neighbor. On a larger scale, helping at our Soup Kitchen and Pantry are great ways to be neighborly.



Helping a neighbor actually benefits you too! Some results of being a good neighbor include stronger social connections, a better sense of purpose, improved life satisfaction and decreased social isolation. Cognitive function also improves when you help friends and neighbors. Of course, your spiritual well being is lifted and your stamina can also increase by helping others. There are so many benefits from helping, I don't think it's possible to restrict this activity to a single, celebrated day. Why not help someone every single day of the year? You will benefit, and imagine the results for those that receive your help! Our neighborhoods and cities would be so much better if everyone tried to lend just one helping hand to someone every day. So, what do you say Mateys? Help someone swab the deck, hoist the sails or navigate the sea.....I know you can do it! Enjoy your journey of helping. You will feel so much better yourself!


