Motion 16: Children's Color and Murals: Rather than place durable children's musical instruments to the Church/Parsonage greenspace, we propose adding colorful mural elements to what we already have.

1) Repaint the Historic White Board adding children-themed color, and potentially visual cartoon graphics (mural elements) rendering aspect of the history (bell, Hager, etc.);



- 2) Add another panel on the rear side of the Historic White Board to continue the mural elements;
- 3) Colorfully paint the shed to continue the mural elements;



4) Paint to match the theme, one of the Lending Library Cabinets, mount it and keep it stocked with children's books;



- 5) Replace one of the Horizontal Sign panels on the main church sign with a child friendly message and a continuation of the color.
- 6) Chalk or paint (with City approval) hopscotch on Potomac sidewalks.



These efforts signal to the community Zion's love for children, families, all children of God. Adding the color and mural elements meets the goals and overarching components of the Plan.

Estimate – The City paid \$4,000. For this mural.
