

Consistory Highlights

The Consistory has been busy reviewing and discussing the church's Visioning and Strategic Planning initiatives. After much preparation, we held the Congregational Meeting on Sunday Oct 12, where the congregation voted unanimously to pass the 11 motions prepared by the Visioning Team, outlining future goals and improvements of Zion. Among these plans is a proposal to add colorful mural elements to the children's outdoor area. It was also decided that proceeds from the sale of the Keefer House will be divided equally—half to the endowment and half to support vision projects.

Many thanks to Burnie Clutz for all of his efforts with landscaping beautification of the parsonage. Now we will move our beautification to the interior. Prep and Painting began on Oct 13th of the 1st floor, in anticipation of moving our history room in early January. We will delay painting the second floor until the spring as part of next year's budget.

Pastor Scott and the church's grant writers have been busy securing funding for several important projects. A grant request has been submitted to continue documenting and mapping Zion's graveyard, Pastor Scott is finalizing a \$50,000 FEMA grant to support facility improvements, and the church received a \$3,000 grant from the Maryland Food Bank to enhance safety and accessibility in the food pantry area.

Recent Outreach events have been a great success! The Resource Fair welcomed 56 guests and connected community members with important local services, including help enrolling in medical benefits. The Genealogy Class led by Carol Miller - Schultz drew participants from several states, with one attendee discovering a possible link to Elizabeth Hager.

We hope everyone will join us for Homecoming Sunday on November 2! It's a time to celebrate, reconnect, and share memories—so invite your friends, family, and anyone who's ever been part of Zion to come home for this special day. We will have a very special service, followed by a reception in our chapel.

We will start off the month running with Jonathan Hager week! Zion is supporting Hagerstown's Parks and Recreation Department in Founder's Week, celebrating 250 years of Jonathan Hager's legacy. Events include a walking tour, lectures, a keynote celebration on Thursday in our Zion Sanctuary, and ending with a ghost tour in our cemetery on Friday night. Please check out these events!

Are You Ready? - A Parish Nurse Note

It will happen. You need to be prepared. End of life planning is a subject many put off until it is too late. This may be difficult to talk about, but it can make a very emotional and difficult time a much easier process for your family and friends. Making a will or deciding on a living trust regarding your assets is often the first step; this is vital for young families with small children. The physical and financial care of minor children should be outlined in case of parental death. A living will, MOLST (medical orders for life sustaining treatment) form and preferences for organ and tissue donations clarify your wishes for your family and first responders. A medical power of attorney can be designated to make healthcare decisions in accordance with your wishes if you are unable to make those decisions. End of life housing preferences can be made known (i.e. stay at home with caregivers, enter assisted/nursing home living, hospice care, etc.).



What do you want when you die...a visitation, a funeral, cremation, to donate your body to science? Making these decisions for your family can alleviate lots of stress. Funerals can be prepaid at the funeral home of your choice. Think about your favorite scriptures, hymns and poems that could be part of your remembrance. You can even write your own obituary. It is often difficult for family members to remember when and where you graduated, all the places you worked, and which organizations you participated in. Having all this information written and available can be a blessing to your family.

The financial aspects of dealing with a loved ones' death can be overwhelming. Create a list of your assets and liabilities: include properties, rentals, mortgages, life insurance policies, checking and savings accounts, brokerage accounts, pension or 401K retirement accounts, CDs and treasury bonds, Social Security payments, car loans, credit cards, jewelry and other valuables (including art and collectibles) and cash. Keeping all this information in one accessible place and updating it periodically is very helpful. And don't forget that your loved ones will need to be able to access your information. List all your usernames and passwords; don't forget your computer, cell phone, email accounts, medical insurance, and Social Security information. Having a list of all your bills, when they are usually due, and how they are paid (direct withdrawal, online, by mail) will help simplify your estate. Keep your contacts list up to date to be sure that everyone is notified of your passing in a timely manner.

And last, but not least, consider how you would like your social media accounts handled (have your listing deleted or memorialized). There are lots of dead people still on social media sites! Be prepared, and in doing so, you will lessen the burden on your family and friends; you may even get a better understanding of who you are and what you achieved in your life!


